

### Math Performance, Grades 3-8, 2016-2023











### Math Performance by Subgroup, Grades 3-8, 2019-2023





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# Change in Math Achievement by proportion FRPL in New Jersey districts




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# Change in Reading Achievement by proportion FRPL in New Jersey districts

### New Jersey Math Achievement By Race and Economic Status


