







#### Math Performance by Subgroup, Grades 3-8, 2019-2023









## Change in Reading Achievement 2019-2022 by proportion FRPL in Ohio districts





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# Change in Math Achievement 2022-2023 by proportion FRPL in Ohio districts







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# Change in Math Achievement 2019-2023 by proportion FRPL in Ohio districts





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# Change in Reading Achievement 2019-2023 by proportion FRPL in Ohio districts



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




